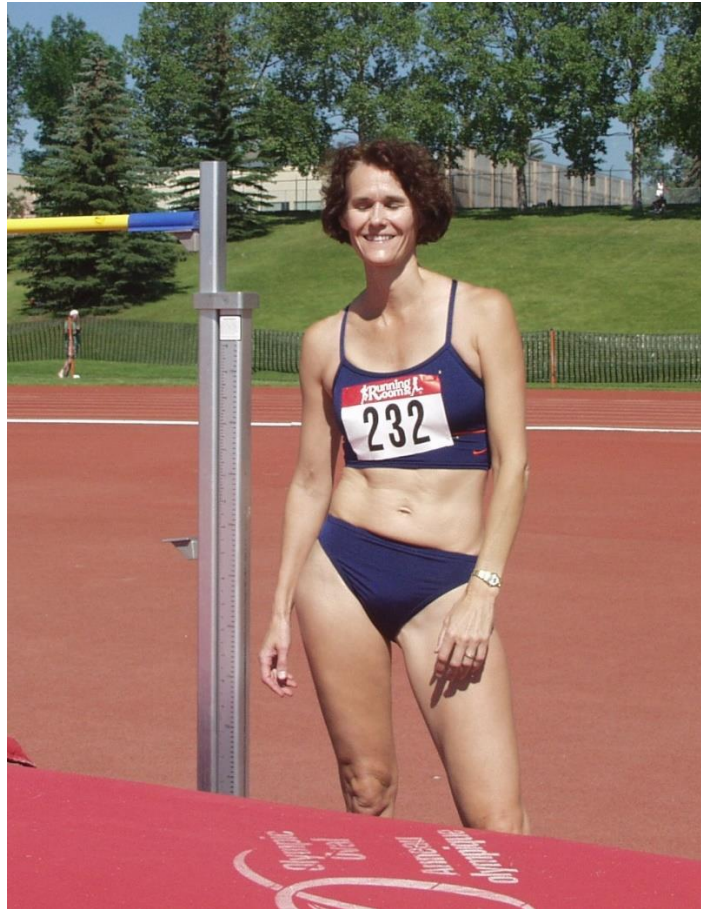


Debbie Brill



Debbie Brill is well-known as a World record-setter in the High Jump, competing in the Olympics three times, and still holding Canadian open women's records for the High Jump Indoors (set in 1982) and Outdoors (set in 1984).

In Masters competition, Debbie set World records in the High Jump for age groups W35, W40, W45 and W50, and still has six Canadian age group records. Her W35 World record has lasted 28 years to date. She won a W40 Silver Medal at the WMA Championships in 1995, and a Gold Medal with a W45 World record in 1999, at a height of 1.76m, which record still stands. She also holds a W50 world record of 1.50m, set in 2004.

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
